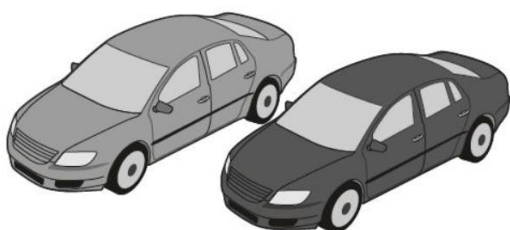

$33 + 7 = 40$

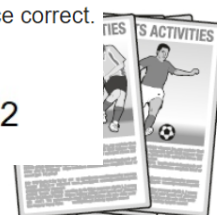
$73 + 7 = 80$
